Koorie Engagement Support Officers

The role of the Koorie Engagement Support Officers (KESOs) is to engage and support Aboriginal students, their families, teachers & school staff. KESOs are members of the Aboriginal community with an understanding of Aboriginal culture and history.

Supports Available

The KESOs provide a range of supports and services available to early childhood service providers, schools and Koorie families including –

- Aboriginal Community Understanding and Safety Training
- Resources and advice to incorporate Koorie Perspectives into the Education Curriculum
- Resources and advice to create culturally inclusive learning environments
- Support to improve child/student wellbeing, attendance, and engagement

Kindergarten Funding Support

Early Start Kindergarten (ESK)

Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) is Department of Education and Training funding subsidy program which provides three-year-old eligible children, with access to 15 hours a week of free or low-cost kindergarten.

ESK Eligibility Criteria

ESK is available to children who are at least **three years old by 30 April** in the year they are enrolled to attend the kindergarten program and either -

- Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Are known to Child Protection
- Are from a refugee or asylum seeker background

How to access ESK

ESK can be accessed by families in sessional kindergartens and within long day care services offering a kindergarten program.

Sessional Kindergarten Program

In most cases, accessing ESK in a sessional kindergarten will be **free**. Children will be enrolled to attend the service for **15 hours per week** according to a set timetable. Kindergarten enrolments are made by contacting the relevant local government central kindergarten enrolment service.

Long Day Care Kindergarten Program

In most cases, accessing ESK in a Long Day Care service will not be fully subsidised by the Department of Education. Depending on how many days the child is enrolled to attend the service, families may incur a cost. Services can be contacted directly for enrolment and service tours.

home.


