Supporting the Afghan community.

Komak connects young people and families to local support and services that help them to thrive. Our discreet professional support service is available for all Afghans, including Hazara, Pashtun and Tajik families, young people, peers, community leaders and professionals.

The program has been developed in partnership with your community and the Komak team is dedicated to providing free, culturally appropriate support.

Community and youth leaders from the Afghan community work in partnership with Komak, which includes:

- Family support, youth and recreation services
- Peer support models
- Mental health services
- Drug and alcohol services
- Cultural and religious support
- Involvement in social and cultural events such as Eid, Ramadan and Muharram.

Komak works in a culturally sensitive way to prevent your young people from making choices

that could affect their long-term wellbeing. We respond quickly to community and parent concerns in ways that put people first.

Komak delivers community awareness training and education including *ThinkUKnow* (cyber-awareness), as well as teaching organisations to more effectively work with Afghan people.

We are a not-for-profit, community services organisation that's worked alongside local communities across Victoria and Tasmania for over 100 years. We are funded by the Victorian Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to run Komak.
